BIO-DATA

N.M. JOSHI (1879-1955).

N.M. Joshi, the father of the Trade Union Movement in India and a pioneer in labour legislation, was born on 5th June 1879 at Goregaon in Bombay Presidency. Graduated from the Deccan College, Poona, in 1901; worked as a teacher from 1901 to 1909; joined the Servants of India Society in 1909; started a sister institution, the Social Service League & was its General Secretary, 1911-53 and later its Vice-President and President from 1953-55; formed and presided over the Bombay Civil Liberties Union, 1937-38; started the All India Trade Union Congress, 1921 and was its Secretary till 1929; Visited U.S.A., and European countries several times to attend International Labour Conferences, Commissions, etc.; nominated to represent Indian Labour at the I.L.O., 1922-48; was a Govt. nominee at the Three Round Table Conferences and on the Joint Parliamentary Committee; appointed a member of the Royal Commission on Indian Labour, 1929-30; Chairman, Labour Sub-Committee of the Indian National Planning Commission, 1937; responsible for several enactments on labour welfare; worked as Manager of 'Dnanaprakash' - the Marathi daily of the Servants of India Society; started a Marathi Weekly, the 'Kangar Samachar', 1921; died, 1955.
