### Ramaswamy Venkataraman (1910-2009)

Statesman, a distinguished Legislator and former President of India.

Born on December 4,1910 at village of Rajamadam, Thanjavur district, Tamil Nadu; ed. Madras University; Advocate, Madras High Court, 1935, Supreme Court, 1951; detained during the Quit India Movement, 1942-44; Member, Provisional Parliament, 1950 and Lok Sabha 1951-57, 1977-84; United Nations Administrative Tribunal, 1955-1979; President, United Nation Administrative Tribunal, 1968-79; Member, Madras Legislative Council, 1957-62, 1962-67; Minister of Industry and Labour, Madras Government, 1957-67; Member, Union Planning Commission, 1967-71; Minister of Finance, Government of India, 1980-82; Minister of Defence, 1982-84; Vice President of India, 1984-87; President of India, 1987-92; etc.; Awarded Tamra Patra for participation in freedom struggle; recipient of a Souvenir from the Secretary General of United Nations; received Doctorate of Law from the University of Madras, Nagarjuna University; Doctor of Social Sciences, University of Roorkee; Soviet Land Prize for his travelogue on K. Kamraj's visit to Socialist countries, etc. Died, 12th January 2009
